


OLD TESTAMENT CHARACTER GUIDE

She was left with her two daughters-in-law, whom she sent back to their parents to find new husbands. Ruth decided Naomi was a fighter. She never gave up, even though she lost her husband, two sons, and a daughter-in-law. She was a refugee (imagine the challenges of different languages, dialects, customs, food, etc.) with no means to provide for herself in a patriarchal culture.

She could be called the female Job in the Bible. She struggled with depression and surely was Naomi's belief in God must have run deep. Perhaps Naomi knew at any moment God could break through and change her story just like

ELISHA

865-795 BC • 1 KINGS 19:19-21; 2 KINGS 2-13

ABOUT

Elisha was a prophet to Israel, the Northern Kingdom, around the 9th century BC.

He trusted God to provide, since he walked away from Elisha eliminated all options of going back to his ordinary life by killing his oxen and burning his farming equipment (1 Kings 19:21).

Elisha had a compassionate heart.

He was a powerful man by reputation. It was clear God's power was with him. Elisha performed many miracles throughout 2 Kings 2-13.

Elisha was fully committed to following Elijah and God's plan. In 2 Kings 2, Elijah asked him several times to stay

Elijah mentored Elisha to take his place.

His most famous miracles came from these moments, like proclaiming a drought over the land in front of King Ahab (1 Kings 17:1) and calling down fire from heaven to defeat 850 false
